Maasai families are without food due to COVID-19 restrictions REQUEST FOR HELP

Progress Report

Thank you to all of you who have contributed to help secure food for a Maasai community in dire need. Generous contributions from children to seniors from \$5 to \$1000 have come in and allowed us to help.

On Wednesday (April 28) I sent some funds to Kenya to get a few days worth of food to these families while we waited for donations to come in. Instead of 29 families there were 38 needing help. Now there is a light joy in the community knowing that many are eating while we arrange for next week.

On Monday (May 4), Benedict (the Esukuta Primary School Director) will coordinate the balance of two weeks of food (maize, beans, oil, and salt). We believe the numbers of



families in need will grow beyond 38. Therefore, ADEA is sending enough funds for 45 families and 15 elderly widows. Additionally, we will pay the missed March and April wages of the eight Maasai teachers at Esukuta School.

As many countries are extending homestay into June, it is reasonable to believe that Kenya will do the same. Therefore, we must plan for food needs beyond these initial two weeks. Also, to pay May teacher wages.

Thank you again for your generous giving and prayer. The need is not over, but for few weeks we have saved children and parents the pain and shame of starvation.
